

Homily Summary – Epiphany

Short Overview: The Feast of the Epiphany celebrates the revelation of Jesus Christ as Savior of all nations. Through the journey of the Magi, we see that God’s salvation is not limited to insiders or the already-religious, but reaches outward to seekers, outsiders, and all who follow the light God places before them. The Epiphany invites us to seek Christ, adore Him, and become bearers of His light to the world.

Main Points

1. **Epiphany Means Revelation**
 - God reveals His Son not only to Israel but to the Gentiles through the Magi.
 - Salvation is universal - no one is excluded from God’s loving plan.
 2. **The Magi vs. the “Insiders”**
 - The Magi were outsiders, guided by creation (a star), yet they acted with courage and faith.
 - The religious experts knew the prophecies but did not move; Herod responded with fear.
 - True faith involves action, not just knowledge.
 3. **Seeking Leads to Adoration**
 - The Magi follow wonder, not power.
 - Their gifts symbolize Christ as King (gold), God (frankincense), and Savior who will suffer (myrrh).
 - Their worship points us to the Eucharist, where we offer Christ our hearts, lives, and wounds.
 4. **God’s Love Breaks All Barriers**
 - In a divided world, Epiphany proclaims unity, dignity, and universal love.
 - Every person is loved, chosen, and invited into God’s light.
 5. **Our Call Today**
 - God places “stars” in each one’s life - an invitation through prayer, people, or challenges.
 - We are called to follow, adore, and return “by another way,” transformed.
 - Christians are meant to become living epiphanies - signs of Christ’s light to others.
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Key Bible Verses

- **Matthew 2:1–12** - The visit of the Magi
 - **Isaiah 60:1–6** - “Nations shall come to your light”
 - **Ephesians 3:2–3a, 5–6** - Gentiles are co-heirs in Christ
 - **Matthew 5:16** - “Let your light shine before others”

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Reflection Questions

1. When have I felt like an “outsider” in my faith journey—and how might God be drawing me closer?
2. What “star” is God placing in my life right now?
3. Do I allow my knowledge of faith to move me toward action and worship?
4. What gifts—time, talents, wounds, or struggles—am I being invited to offer Christ?
5. How can I be an epiphany, a sign of Christ’s light, to others this week?
