Homily Summary – Solemnity of Christ the King (2025)

Main Points

1. Christ the King: A King Who Chooses Us

- Jesus is not a distant ruler but a King who desires friendship with us (John 15:15).
- By surrendering to Him, we find unexpected freedom, joy, and purpose.
- Christ's kingship is rooted in humility—He reigns from the Cross (John 18:33–37).

2. Christ the King in Father Greg's Life

- Fr. Greg's personal testimony: growing in awareness of Christ's gentle leadership and discovering the peace that comes from placing Him first.
- Allowing Christ to be King is a lifelong journey of trust, surrender, and grace.

3. Parish Life as an Expression of Christ's Kingdom

- Our new parish website highlights many ways to get involved: ministries, groups, prayer opportunities, service, and outreach.
- Participation in parish life is one way of letting Jesus reign in our hearts, families, and community.

4. Christ at the Center of Advent

- The upcoming Colamici concert is an opportunity to start Advent focused on Christ.
- Inviting others to worship, pray, and encounter beauty is an act of evangelization—offering others a chance to meet the King.

5. Christ the King in the Lives of the Young

- This week's Confirmations at our two elementary schools reveal the Holy Spirit forming our young people into strong witnesses for Christ.
- In Confirmation, Christ strengthens His children for mission (Acts 1:8).

6. Christ the King in RCIA

- With 18 RCIA participants and many celebrating the Rite of Acceptance, we see tangible signs of God drawing hearts to Himself.
- These candidates are freely choosing to follow Christ the King and enter His Church.

- Colossians 1:12–20 Christ is the image of the invisible God and King of creation.
- Revelation 19:16 "King of kings and Lord of lords."

- 3. How can I help build Christ's kingdom in my parish through prayer, service, and involvement?
- 4. How will I intentionally put Christ at the center of my Advent season?
- 5. What can I learn from those receiving Confirmation or entering RCIA about choosing Christ boldly and joyfully?
